- 2. Click on the American Job Centers link located under the Workforce Innovation & Opportunity Act section



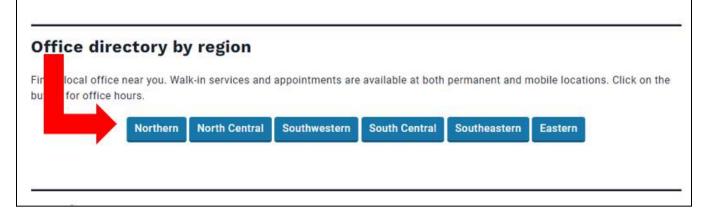
Workforce Innovation & Opportunity Act

The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) is a federally funded program that establishes the Workforce Development System and provides funding to support training and employment services for adults, dislocated workers, and low-income, out-of-school youth.

The Workforce Development System is made up of the Idaho Workforce Development Council, a single statewide planning region, and numerous state and local employment and training organizations that work in partnership to bring services to Idaho students, job seevers, and employers.

Customers can access the full range of WIOA services through the American Job Centers located in each of the six geographic regions of the state.

3. Select the Workforce office in your region (closest to your residence)



- 4. Contact your closest local workforce and request eligibility screening for a WIOA Grant for training (WRITE DOWN YOUR ASSIGNED CASE WORKERS NAME & EMAIL AS YOU WILL NEED THAT FOR THE NEXT STEP)
- 5. Required information to complete this step:
 - **Vour local Caseworkers contact information (Name & Email address)**
 - Your desired start date

NOTE: Start Date needs to be at least 2 weeks from today's date

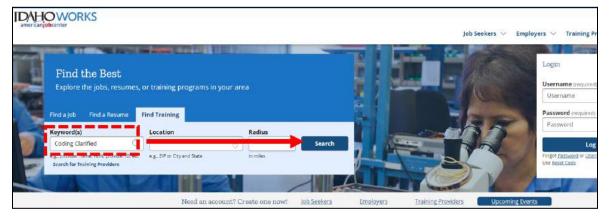
